Nietzsche wants to move beyond simple concepts of good and evil, abandon the assessment of individuals through resentment, and restore men to their former wonderful ability. Here he discusses the implication of language to our acquisition of knowledge. However, Nietzsche argues that these powerless beings are not better than the powerful beings. Nietzsche focused essentially on the end of religion. It is this connection that requires the utmost of attention to make it possible to receive the answer you are looking for. Two different men that studied two different parts of philosophy. His work has since influenced, impacted, and brought forth new questions for many philosophers to follow. There are critical imbalances in it that cause much of humanity to suffer. The issue with uniformity is the fact we become experts at fulfilling expectations and not discover the true self.
